



## TEACH ENGLISH IN KOREA

**WHAT:** Team-teach in a middle or high school in the Gyeonggi province of Korea. You will work together with a Korean classroom teacher to inspire students and to make English come alive.

**WHEN:** Starting date is August 2005. Contracts are for one year, renewable.

**WHO:** Those who hold a Bachelor's degree in any field. Teaching experience and knowledge of Korean are not necessary.
